

MOONSHOT COMPOST & RECYCLING-MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN CLIMATE CHANGE

Nearly 33% of all food produced globally for human consumption ends up in the trash, according to the Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations. Excess food makes up approximately 20% of landfills. As this excess food decomposes, it produces methane at sufficient levels to constitute nearly 10% of total global greenhouse gas emissions. The UN Climate Change Conference said our methane gas emissions were a major contributor to climate change, and many nations (including the US) promised to reduce their methane emissions. Since 2020 food waste diverted from landfill=663,312 lbs

It was very impressive when UOCC hosted Moonshot Compost as our presenter at the Neighborhood Social Hour. It was not previously realized that food waste made methane gas when it was sent to the garbage dump! \$29 a month seemed like a small price to pay to divert that waste into compost. NEW UOAKS BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION

The University Oaks Civic Club (UOCC) Board of Directors Election is coming up in May. This is a pivotal election. The present Board's term ends August 31, 2022, and the new Board's first two-year term begins September 1, 2022. In order to facilitate the process to elect the new Board of Directors, the current board is requesting UO residents to volunteer to form a new Board Member Election Committee. The election committee will be chaired by Mrs. Janine Cashion, then assisted by Mr. Cashion and Mr. Penn. The duties of the Election Committee will be to solicit candidates, organize their presentations at the monthly meetings, and organize voting process on election day.

The past two years our monthly civic club meetings have all been virtual. The last two elections we had two different gatherings to brainstorm ideas for the candidates. Subjects that were broached were the high points of UOaks, what works well, and what we do want to continue? What changes will improve the neighborhood? Towards the end of each of these meetings, the facilitator raised this question: Which of you will run for the Board to carry these ideas forward? A brief bio of each candidate was then published in the newsletter. At the April Civic Club meeting prior to the May election, a large meeting was held at which each candidate had an opportunity to state why he/she is running. This year will be the same process. UOCC hopes to create the Election Committee in March 2022, present potential board candidates at the April 13th CC Meeting, and vote for the new board members in May.

March newsletter- full description of election process/closing date for nominations.

April CC meeting-candidates present.

April Newsletter-candidates bio in April newsletter.

May - Election event at Breakfast on the Bayou.

DISCOVERY GREEN







Discovery Green is a gem of an urban park, an environmental showcase that sits very close to University Oaks. It is a nationally recognized gold rated 12-acre park designed to use the latest technology in "green" building methods, energy conservation, sustainable environmentally friendly park operations.

Discovery Green outdoor fitness classes are plentiful. The classes include Yoga, HIIT, Pilates, and Tai Chi. Grab your picnic baskets, blankets, and lawn chairs. DG hosts "Screen on the Green" family-friendly movies. UHD hosts a Thursday Night Concert Series featuring very talented bands and musicians. Toddler Tuesday is scheduled every Tuesday in April, but a very special Texan Toddler Tuesday is scheduled Feb. 22 with a rodeo mascot and clown. HLSR will give a roping demonstration. There are always ongoing exhibitions throughout the park. The current one is Mosaic Music with beautiful mosaics synchronized to music. This is best viewed in the late evening/night. DG also includes a dog park. These activities are all FREE to the public. Simplest and sometimes best, there are 12 acres with playgrounds to just let the kids play. Grab a ball for them to kick and chase, pack a picnic, and enjoy the day in a safe nature filled environment. You can get to DG on the Metrorail at the Wheeler station. How user-friendly is that? No parking or traffic concerns. Children 5 and younger ride free, otherwise \$1.25.

There are seasonal activities and events that do charge nominal fees. The roller skating rink (The Rink) is open every day, but only for five weeks starting Friday, March 4. Check the schedule for times and the theme (Disco, Rodeo, 80's, etc.). There may be a different theme every day of the week. During the winter holiday season there is ice skating. The skating rink is located next to the Lake House Café which offers an affordable café menu. Currently there is an open air mini-golf experience called Pixar Putt available until March 20. Kayaks are available on Kinder Lake for \$5.00. You can Kayak every weekend starting in the Spring and through the entire week of Spring Break.
